Seychelles to benefit from 2 new IMF programmes



Over the course of the next three years, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) is to support Seychelles to strengthen its macroeconomic stability, fiscal and monetary policy frameworks and the implementation of reforms to boost investments in human and physical capital to support inclusive growth.

The support is through a new arrangement between the Seychelles government and IMF. The new Extended Fund Facility programme has replaced the previous one, signed in July 2021.

Under the new EFF, Seychelles will have access to US\$56 million.

Similarly, Seychelles is also receiving financial support for the total sum of US\$46 million, through a newly launched programme called Resilience and Sustainability Facility (RSF), which will help to build resilience to climate change. This programme is also for a period of three years.

Minister Naadir Hassan has welcomed the support of the IMF.

"The IMF has proven to be a strong and faithful partner of the Seychelles, throughout the country's economic downturn. As we move on the next phase of our development, the government is grateful to the IMF for the additional support under the new EFF. The government is equally grateful to the IMF for recognizing the vulnerability of our country to climate change and the high cost of boosting our resilience to such phenomenon, which has enabled Seychelles to also benefit under the RSF programme."



FITCH REPORT



Fitch Ratings has affirmed Seychelles' Long-Term Foreign-Currency Issuer Default Rating (IDR) at 'BB-' with a Stable Outlook. According to Fitch, Seychelles' 'BB-' rating is supported by relatively high income levels (3x the peer median), strong World Bank Governance Indicators, support from multilateral creditors and stable policymaking. These strengths are balanced by the exceptionally high concentration of the economy in the tourism sector, which heightens vulnerability to external shocks, and long-term risks associated with climate change.'

The rating was published early in April and is accessible on the Ministry's website.

Seychelles has been upgraded on another five recommendations set by the Financial Action Task Force (FATF).

The upgrade came after a delegation attended the 45th meeting of the Eastern and Southern Africa Anti-Money Laundering Group (ESAAMLG) Task Force of Senior Officials, held in Arusha, Tanzania from 26th to 31st March 2023.

The delegation was led by the Secretary of State for Finance, National Planning and Trade, Mr Patrick Payet, who also chairs the National Anti-Money Laundering and Countering the Financing of Terrorism (AML/CFT) Committee.

At the meeting of the Task Force of Senior Officials, Seychelles



defended its third re-rating request report to address five deficiencies identified within the Second Mutual Evaluation Report adopted in September, 2018, in a bid to strengthen its AML/CFT legislative framework.

The five FATF recommendations (5,19, 25, 28 and 34) relates to Terrorist Financing offence, Higher-risk countries, Transparency and Beneficial Ownership of Legal Persons, Regulation and Supervision of Designated Non-Financial Business or Professions (DNFBPs) and Guidance and Feedback respectively.

The National AML/CFT Committee is continuing to address the remaining six technical compliance shortcomings for discussion in the April 2024 ESAAMLG meeting.

To date, Seychelles is either Compliant or Largely Compliant on 34 of the 40 FATF Recommendations.







IMF/World Bank Spring Meetings

The Minister of Finance, National Planning and Trade, Mr. Naadir Hassan, lead a high level delegation at the IMF/World Bank Spring meetings in Washington, on 10th-16th April 2023.

The Spring Meetings of the Boards of Governors of the World Bank Group (WBG) and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) bring together central bankers, ministers of finance and development, private sector executives, representatives from civil society organizations and academics to discuss issues of global concern, including the world economic outlook, poverty eradication, economic development, and aid effectiveness.

On the sideline, the Seychelles delegation also held several meetings with other organisations, such as the Saudi Fund for Development and the OPEC Fund for International Development to discuss ongoing engagements, Bretton Woods institutions, Commonwealth Finance Ministers High-Level Working Group Meeting, and the 2023 ECOSOC Financing for Development (FfD) Forum.

IMF reviewing VAT framework



In May, the IMF Fiscal Team on VAT had a meeting at Liberty House, to brief Minister Naadir Hassan on the review they are conducting on the current VAT framework.

Upon the conclusion of the review, the team will present their findings and propose recommendations on how best to modernize the current VAT framework.

The review of the VAT framework by the IMF Fiscal Team started last year.

AfDB takes stock of ongoing projects

A delegation from the African Development Bank (AfDB) was in Seychelles in early May, conducting a mid-term review Country Portfolio Performance.

The mid-term review is effected as part of the bank's Country Strategy Paper for Seychelles, which is for the period 2021 to 2025.

The aim is to take stock of the implementation of projects, to which the institution is providing financial support.

Currently, the institution is financing nine projects in Sevchelles.



In Brief



The 13th Commonwealth Regional Conference for Heads of Anti-Corruption Agencies in Africa was held in Seychelles in mid -May.

Minister Naadir Hassan attended the opening ceremony, where he gave a presentation on the topic of 'Returning stolen assets to Seychelles and the government support in fighting corruption through ACCS funding.'

"Any country that is serious about fighting corruption and bringing back stolen assets needs to have very close working relationships with other law enforcement agencies in other countries", said Minister Hassan.





In May, Minister Hassan launched the FTC's Complaints and Market Surveillance software, which will enable the commission to better manage cases received more efficiently and effectively, provide a platform to analyse data obtained through surveys in the market faster and even provide the general public with the accessibility to track their complaints.

Minister Hassan said "I commend the FTC and its staff for making use of the opportunity to transform their day-to-day operations and improve their service delivery. My sincere wish is that the FTC ensures that the software is explored and utilized to its maximum potential."

A high level delegation, headed by Minister Naadir Hassan, completed a strategic mission in Australia on Tax administration and Customs management reforms in May.

During the week long mission, 11 meetings were held with Australian officials from the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, Treasury Department, the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) and the Australian Border Force (ABF).

Accompanying Minister Hassan were the chairperson of SRC, Chrystold Chetty, Paul Barrack of Customs, Yannick Vel, DG MFAB and Trade Consultant, Charles Morin.












A delegation including representatives from the Department of Finance, attended the 10th Global Forum Competent Authority Conference in Tbilisi Georgia on 15th and 16th May.

The head of delegation was the Secretary of State, Patrick Payet.

The conference provided the competent authorities of the Global Forum members the opportunity to meet and share their practical experience in exchange of information, both on request and automatic, to refresh their knowledge and to benefit from an update on the Global Forum tools. The Seychelles delegation took the opportunity to engage with the competent authorities of a number of jurisdictions with which it has established exchange of information relationships, and to discuss and seek support for its forthcoming Exchange of Information on Request Peer Review Report.

Ministry launches Customer Feedback Management Policy



The Ministry of Finance, National Planning and Trade has launched its Customer Feedback Management Policy.

The objective of the policy is to: establish a formal structure to enable members of the public to directly contact the Ministry, increase interactions between the two sides, improve service delivery, therefore allowing for more transparency and accountability in the functions of the latter.

The policy sets out the guidelines under which interactions between the Ministry and members of the public should take place.

The policy and feedback forms are available online on the Ministry's website, where submission will be automatic to an email address.

Physical forms are also available at the Ministry's headquarters, Liberty House.

Educational Loan Scheme is launched

Six commercial banks and Seychelles Credit Union signed an MoU with the Ministry to participate in the Educational loan scheme, launched by the government.

SS Payet signed the document on behalf of the Ministry.

The scheme is to complement the existing scholarship programme of the government.

Under this scheme, only courses aligned to the human resource development strategy, thus driven towards areas of projected increased opportunities for growth and development, will be entertained. The primary features of the educational loan scheme, accessible through the signatory Credit Granting Institutions is as follows:

- A maximum loan value of SR 800,000
- An interest subsidy of 4 percent will be provided by the Government (resulting in interest borne by the Borrower being the Credit Granting Institution's interest rate less 4%)
- · Repayment will be for a maximum of 10 years.
- · There will be a full government guarantee.
- · Personal Contribution will not be compulsory.
- Students can borrow in their own right, therefore no compulsory co-borrowers will be required
- The borrowers would be required to be bonded to the Republic based on the value of the liability for government in relation to the subsidized rates
- The students would not need to commence repayments on their loans until they have graduated and are in receipt of their degree certificate or diploma. In the grace period, the government will cover and disburse to the lending institution its interest rate subsidy, however, the balance student borne interest would be capitalized.



End of GOPA collaboration under the 11th EDF

The collaboration between the Seychelles government and the GOPA Worldwide Consultants, which was financed by the European Union under the 11th European Development Fund, has come to an end.

GOPA Worldwide Consultants started this collaboration in 2019.

In the four years, projects undertaken by GOPA, in particular with the Ministry of Finance, National Planning and Trade are as follows;

Development, Installation and Operationalisation of the new Tax Management System

Development, Installation and Operationsalisation of the Asycuda World Activities

·Redevelopment of SRC website and the Trade Portal and

·Review of IP laws

The GOPA Worldwide Consultants experts have also undertaken projects with Seychelles Bureau of Standards, Fair Trading Commission, Department of Blue Economy, Seychelles Fishing Authority, and Ministry of Investment, Entrepreneurship and Industry.

On Wednesday 23rd May, Mr. Maurizio Zincone, Team Leader of GOPA Worldwide Consultants, paid a courtesy call on Minister Hassan, briefing him on the several projects undertaken by the entity, under the 11th EDF.

"This is inline with the government's digital economy strategy, being implemented by phase, which in the long term will result in a 'cash light' society, with limited cash transactions, especially in government".


Currently, he is training hard to ensure a place in the final team. Rama, works at the Financial Services Development Division, as a Senior Policy Analyst.

Liberty House celebrates Platinum Anniversary



On O2nd June, 1953, Liberty House was inaugurated by Governor Frederick Crawford. Construction work started in the 1940s.

On its inauguration, 70 years ago, Liberty House was known as Queen's Building, to mark the coronation of Queen Elisabeth II. Its name was changed to Liberty House in 1977.

Made out of local granite, the building used to house the government's Savings Bank and the audit department. In 1962, the top floor was home to Radio Seychelles.

Today, it is the Ministry's HQ and also houses the Seychelles Post Office.
